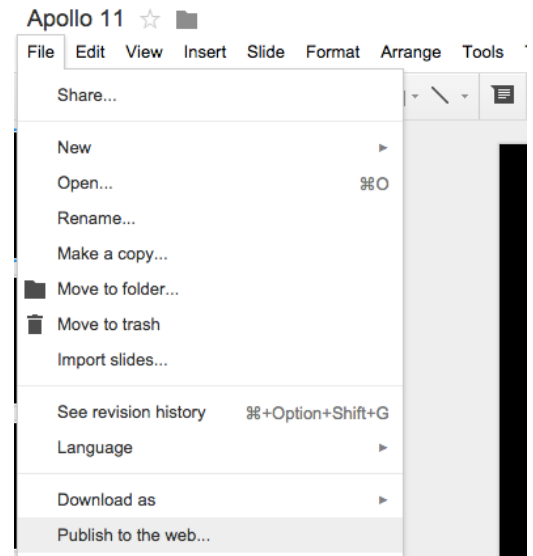


When are finished with a presentation and would like to publish it, here are the steps...

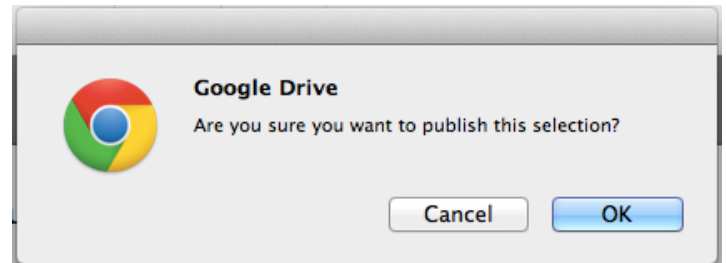
In your presentation, go to the **File** menu and select **Publish to the web...**



Click **Publish**

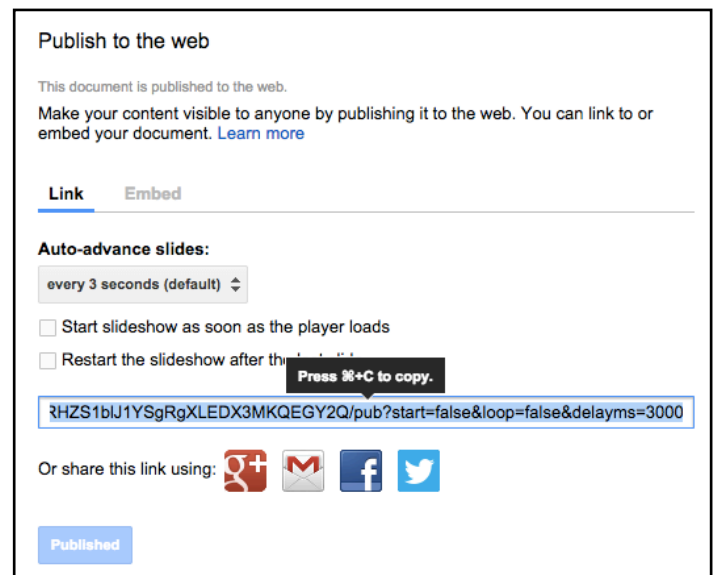


Click **OK**



The **Link** tab is automatically selected.

Use **Command+C** to copy the link.

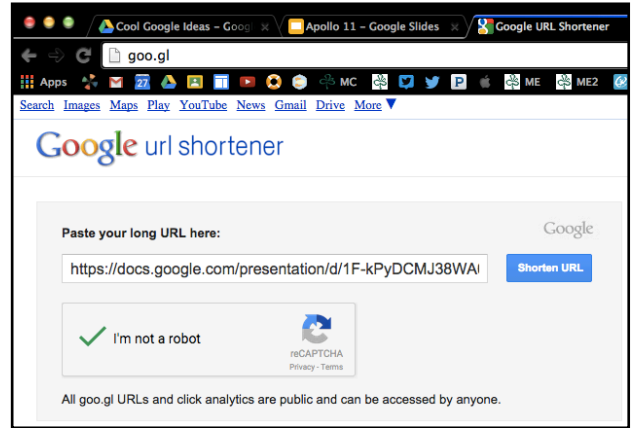


Go to <http://goo.gl>

Paste the link into the box provided

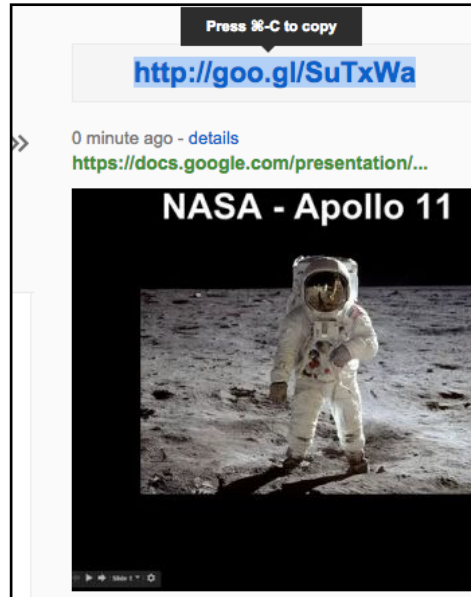
Check the box that says I'm not a robot.

Click **Shorten URL**



The shortened URL can be written on the board and will be easier for students to type into their device.

Click on the **details** link for more options.



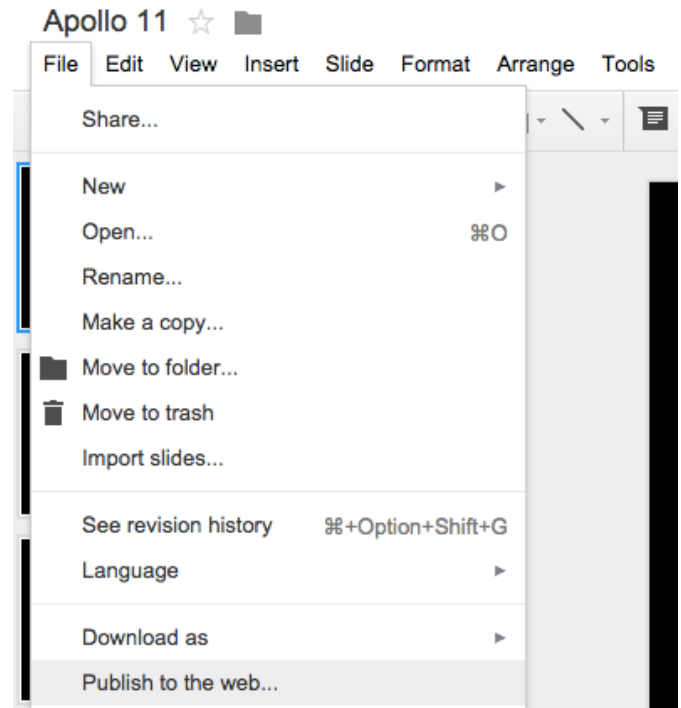
This will take you to the QR code for your published slideshow.

Drag the QR code from this window to your desktop.

Drag the QR code onto a document. It can be printed and kids can scan the code with a [QR reader](#) on an iPod Touch, iPhone, iPad, or Android device to go directly to the published slideshow.

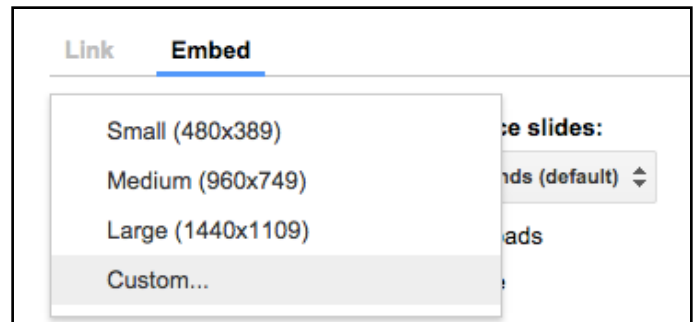


Now let's talk Embedding the published slideshow...



In your presentation, go to the **File** menu and select **Publish to the web...**

Click on the **Embed** tab, and select **Custom** for size.



If you are embedding in a Wiki, I'd suggest 700 pixels is a good width. That is a good width for many websites.

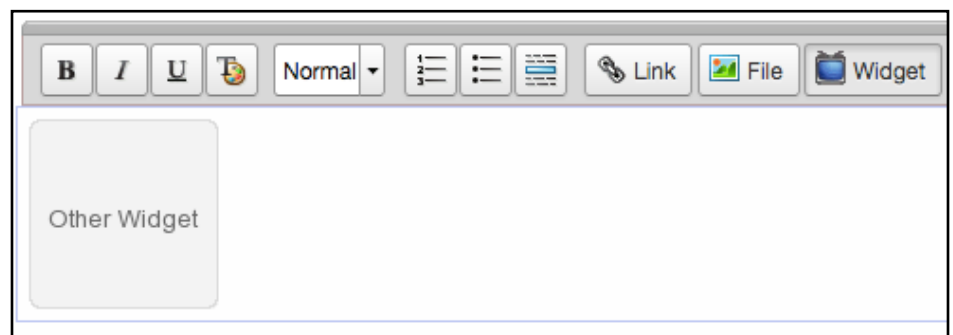
***Teacher website, this width should be 450



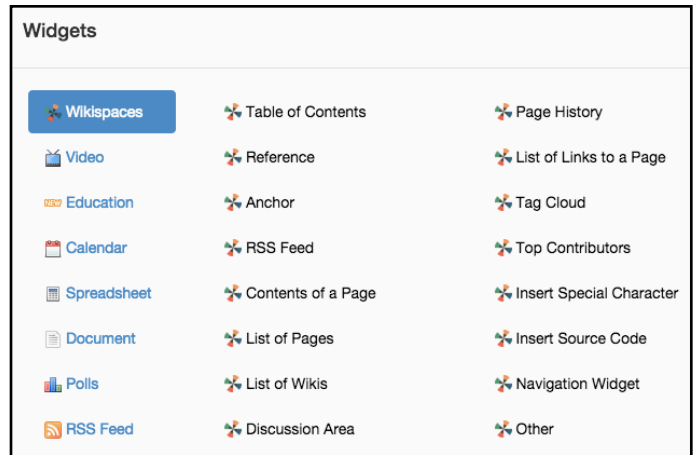
Copy the embed code.

In a Wiki

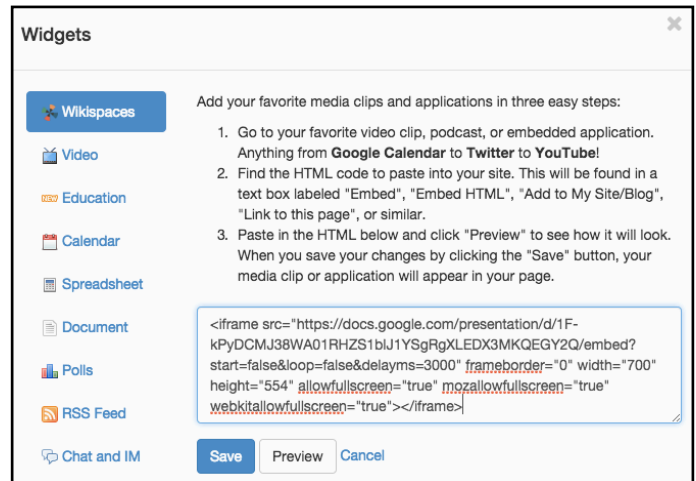
Add a Widget to your page by clicking on the Widget tool.



Select **Other**

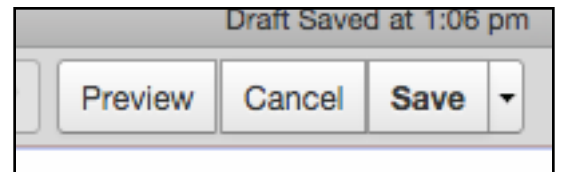


Paste the embed code in the box provided.

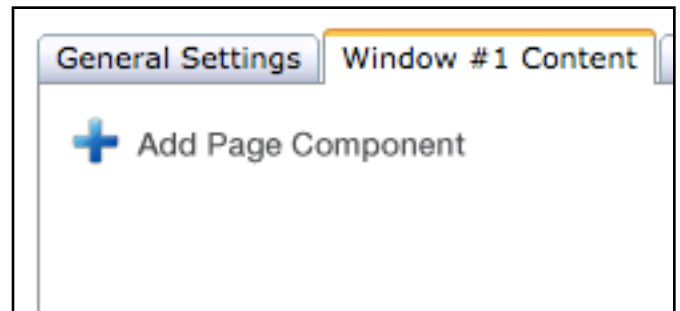


Click **Save** to save the Widget

Click **Save** to save the Wiki

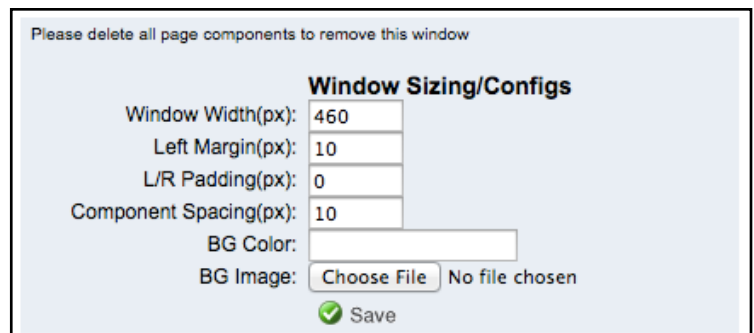


If you are embedding in your **Teacher Webpage**, click on **Window 1**.

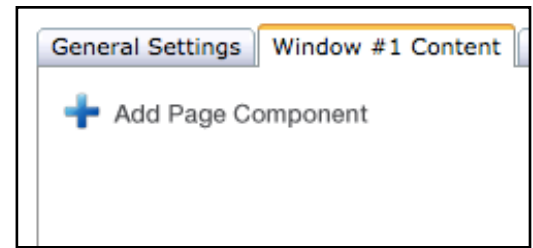


Make note of the window width. As I suggested a width of 700 for the Wiki and other websites, your width cannot exceed the width of the window where it'll be living here on the teacher webpage.

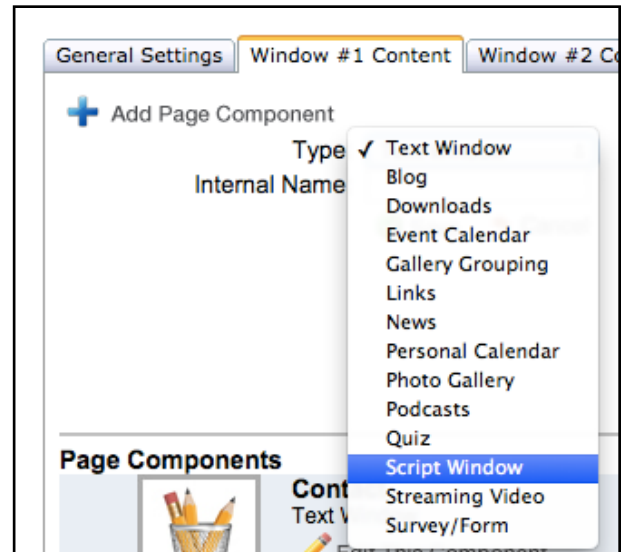
In this case, I want to set the Custom embed width to 450 when I publish in Google. (see *** above)



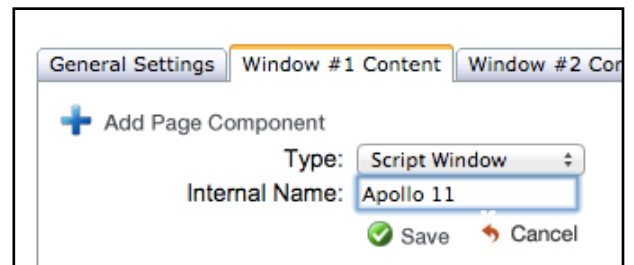
In Window 1 Content, click the **+ Add Page Component**.



Select **Script Window**



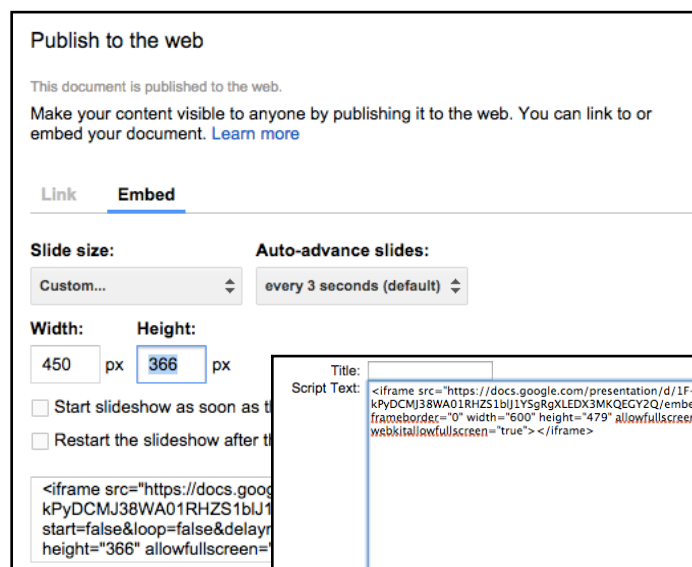
Title it with the title of your published slideshow.



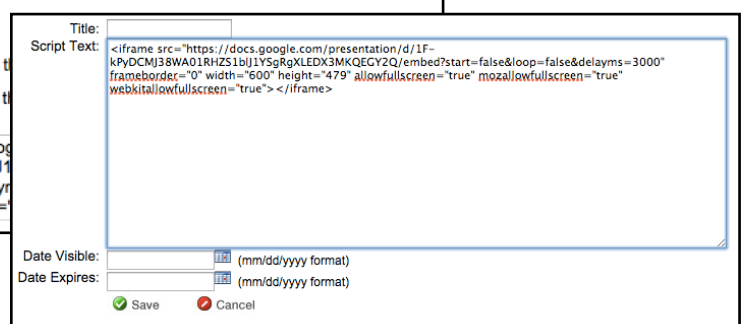
Click **Edit This Component**



Back to the Google publish to the web dialog box, you'll see that I set the width to 450 and grab the embed code.



Paste the embed code into the script text. You don't need a Title.



Click **Save**.
